Although more than 200 million RCC members have been raised out of poverty in the last 20 years, members have yet to feel the full effect of economic progress. The potential impact of credit union development is astounding in a country like China, where millions of people still lack access to basic financial services.


The world is always changing, and together we make a difference—one member at a time. I look forward to seeing you in Calgary.


