JAMAICA — Hurricane Melissa

WFCU Contribution: USD 95,000

On 28 October 2025, Hurricane Melissa (Category 5) struck Jamaica, leaving 45 dead, 300,000+ affected, and USD 7 billion in losses. WFCU deployed USD 95,000 in partnership with TruStage Foundation — one of many international donors who rallied to support Jamaican credit unions.

What the funds covered

- 2,800 care packages — food, water, tarpaulins and hygiene items — to 23 communities across 6 parishes
- 7 Starlink devices restored connectivity for 6 credit union branches
- 150 employees received tiered home-repair grants based on damage severity
- 4 credit unions received grants for solar systems, generators and replacement equipment
- 5 members received grants to rebuild or repair their homes
- Essential supplies also donated to schools, children's homes and elderly care facilities

VIETNAM

— 2025 Flood Disasters

WFCU Contribution: USD 15,000

Vietnam endured 19 consecutive storms in 2025 — 409 dead or missing, 727 injured, USD 3.5 billion in losses. WFCU channeled USD 15,000 through Asian Confederation of Credit Unions to Co-opBank, which coordinated emergency equipment support for People’s Credit Funds (PCFs) across the country.

What was delivered

- Computers, printers and cash-counting machines to 15 PCFs
- Formal handover ceremonies conducted at each location
- PCFs quickly restored member services and operational continuity
- Co-opBank contributed USD 1,677 alongside the WFCU/ACCU grant

SRI LANKA

— Cyclone Ditwah

WFCU Contribution: USD 3,000

Cyclone Ditwah — Sri Lanka's worst natural disaster in 20 years — caused catastrophic flooding, landslides and mass displacement. WFCU funds channeled via Asian Confederation of Credit Unions enabled the Nikaweratiya SANASA Union to launch a zero-interest emergency lending program for flood-affected members.

How funds were used

- Zero-interest loans disbursed to 76 flood-affected members across 7 societies
- Livelihoods supported: paddy farming, vegetables, retail, small hotels, tailoring, brick-making
- SANASA Federation co-contributed LKR 278,574 alongside the ACCU grant
- Revolving model: repayments reinvested into the cooperative system
